

Table of Student Enrolment from 2018-2023




Bar graph of Student Enrolment from 2018-2023



2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

- Academic and Examination Committee (AEC) prepares the timetables of internal examination and informs University examination schedule to the students.
- Two internal examinations per semester are conducted in the college and the answer scripts of the internal examination are evaluated by the faculty of the college within one week after completion of the examination.
- After evaluation of internal assessment tests, the answer scripts are distributed among the students for their self-assessment and to maintain transparency in evaluation.
- After self-assessment, students can place the objections/ grievances regarding score awarded to them before the faculty concerned.

- Faculty should resolve the objections/ grievances raised within three days.
- Unsolved grievances at the teacher level, if any, can be submitted to the in-charge of the department and the same should be resolved within the college.





Table & Bar Graph showing Result Analysis of AY 2018-19



Table & Bar Graph showing Result Analysis of AY 2019-20



Table & Bar Graph showing Result Analysis of AY 2019-20



Table & Bar Graph showing Result Analysis of AY 2021-22


